**PROGRAM
OVERVIEW**

This is our fifth international course. The focus of these laryngeal and pharyngeal cancer conferences has been to bring together experts in the management of laryngopharyngeal cancer to present their unique perspectives. We pride ourselves in offering the only didactic and cadaver course to focus solely on surgical and non-surgical organ preservation. With each successive conference, we feature a new approach to the problem of surgical and non-surgical management of laryngeal and pharyngeal cancer. The conference includes lectures from the experts, panel discussions, poster presentations, and a day of cadaver dissections. This fifth international conference has been expanded to include Transoral Robotic Surgery (TORS) utilizing the daVinci Surgical Robotic System.

From the surgical perspective the conference focuses on contemporary techniques including supracricoid partial laryngectomy, endoscopic laser approaches, tranoral robotic surgical procedures, modified neck dissection as well as numerous other techniques. These techniques are taught both in the lectures and the cadaver lab by notable surgical experts. From the non-surgical perspective, contemporary radiation, chemotherapy, and photodynamic therapy are presented.

In addition to the didactic and cadaver dissection, participants are invited to submit abstracts for the poster session. Abstracts should be submitted for all aspects surgical and non-surgical organ preservation. Honors and prizes will be awarded for poster presentations. This course is intended for all practitioners who are involved in the management of laryngeal and pharyngeal cancer patients including orolaryngologists, head & neck surgeons, radiation oncologists, medical oncologists, nurses, and social workers.

At the completion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- 1) *Discuss and assess patients with laryngeal and pharyngeal carcinoma.*
- 2) *Describe surgical techniques available for the management of laryngeal and pharyngeal carcinoma.*
- 3) *Explain site-specific approaches for the management of laryngeal and pharyngeal carcinoma.*
- 4) *Discuss the role of chemotherapy and radiation therapy in the management of laryngeal and pharyngeal carcinoma.*
- 5) *Describe organ preservation surgical approaches for the management of laryngeal and pharyngeal carcinoma. (Day 3-Prosection)*
- 6) *Demonstrate selective neck dissection for cancer of the larynx and pharynx. (Day 3-Prosection)*
- 7) *Describe the role of Transoral Robotic Surgery (TORS) in the management of laryngeal and pharyngeal carcinoma.*
