This is our fourth international conference on laryngeal cancer. The focus of these conferences has been to bring together experts in the management of laryngeal cancer to both teach and present their unique perspectives in the treatment of this disease. We pride ourselves in offering the only didactic and cadaver course to focus solely on surgical and non-surgical organ preservation. With each successive conference we present a new focus to the problem of surgical and non-surgical management of laryngeal cancer. The conference includes lectures from the experts, interactive panel discussions, poster presentations, and a full day of cadaver dissections. This fourth international conference has been expanded to include organ preservation approaches for pyriform sinus carcinoma.

From the surgical perspective the conference focuses on contemporary techniques including supracricoid partial laryngectomy, endoscopic laser approaches, modified neck dissection as well as numerous other techniques. These techniques are taught both in the lectures and the cadaver lab by notable surgical experts. From the non-surgical perspective, contemporary radiation, chemotherapy and photodynamic therapy are presented.

Poster Abstract Information

In addition to the didactic and cadaver dissection, participants are invited to submit abstracts for the poster session. Abstracts should be submitted on all aspects of surgical and non-surgical larynx preservation. At the completion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- 1) *Discuss and assess patients with laryngeal carcinoma*
- 2) *Describe surgical techniques available for the management of laryngeal carcinoma*
- 3) *Explain site-specific approaches for the management of laryngeal and pyriform sinus carcinoma*
- 4) *Discuss the role of chemotherapy and radiation therapy in the management of laryngeal and pyriform sinus carcinoma*
- 5) *Describe organ preservation surgical approaches for the management of laryngeal and pyriform sinus carcinoma (Day 3-Prosection)*
- 6) *Demonstrate selective neck dissection for cancer of the larynx and pyriform sinus carcinoma (Day 3-Prosection)*
- 7) *Assess several methods to manage speech and swallowing following surgical and non-surgical management of laryngeal and pyriform sinus carcinoma (Day 3-Speech and Swallowing Workshop)*
- 8) *Demonstrate and instruct patients in safe swallowing techniques pertinent to this population following treatment for laryngeal and pyriform sinus carcinoma (Day 3-Speech and Swallowing Workshop)*
- 9) *Discuss functional outcome following organ preservation surgery of the larynx and pyriform sinus carcinoma and explain subsequent anatomical changes and their impact on speech and swallowing skills (Day 3-Speech and Swallowing Workshop)*
- 10) *Discuss the role of head and neck nursing in the management of laryngeal and pyriform sinus cancer patients (Day 3-Head and Neck Nursing Workshop)*

This educational conference is intended for otolaryngologists, head and neck surgeons, radiation oncologists, medical oncologists, speech pathologists, nurses, social workers, and other physicians and health care professionals who are interested in the management of patients with laryngeal cancer.



Petra Ambrosch, MD is Professor and Chair of the Department of Otorhinolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery for the University Hospital Schleswig-Holstein, Campus Kiel in Germany. Dr. Ambrosch has been a pioneer in the rational approach to laser management of both supraglottic and glottic carcinoma.

Frans JM Hilgers, MD, PhD is an experienced otolaryngologist & head and neck surgeon and a world renowned lecturer on new surgical, prosthetic, and functional techniques applied in a comprehensive approach to rehabilitation after total laryngectomy.

Jonas T. Johnson, MD is Professor and Vice-Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh in Pennsylvania. Dr. Johnson is renowned for his contributions to head and neck oncology.

Ollivier Laccourreye, MD is Professor of the Department of Otorhinolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery at Hospital European Georges Pompidou in Paris France. He is renowned for his expertise in both surgical and non-surgical laryngeal organ preservation.

Kerry D. Olsen, MD is Professor of Otolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery at the Mayo Medical Center in Rochester Minnesota. Dr. Olsen has a vast experience in surgical organ preservation of supralottic and glottic carcinoma.

Giorgio Peretti, MD is Professor of Otolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Brescia in Italy. Dr. Peretti has established himself as one of the world leaders in laser resections of laryngeal cancer.

David I. Rosenthal, MD is Associate Professor of Radiation Oncology and Director of Head and Neck Translational Research at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas. Dr. Rosenthal has special expertise in radiation therapy for laryngeal carcinoma.

Ralph P. Tufano, MD is Assistant Professor of Otolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore Maryland. Dr. Tufano has special expertise in the area of organ preservation surgical techniques.

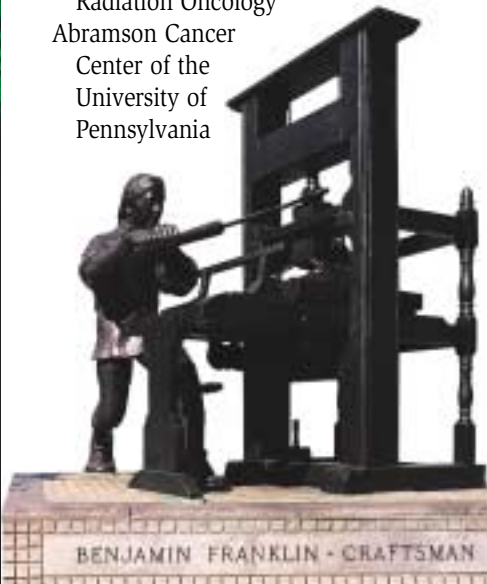
